Assemblin signs framework agreement with Parkering Malmö regarding charging infrastructure

Assemblin Electrical through Assemblin Charge has signed one of the Region Skåne's largest framework agreements for electric vehicle (EV) charging with Parkering Malmö. The agreement covers the sale, delivery, installation and commissioning of up to 3,000 charging points over a period of up to four years.

The framework agreement runs for one year at a time with the possibility of extension for up to a total of four years starting in the first quarter, 2026. The initial volume is estimated at approximately 1,600 charging points, with a maximum ceiling volume of 3,000 charging boxes.

With this agreement, Assemblin will be the main supplier for Parkering Malmö's continued expansion of charging infrastructure in the city of Malmö. Assemblin is responsible for a comprehensive delivery of services regarding EV charging, which means that Parkering Malmö can call for everything from individual charging boxes to complete installations, commissioning and service.

"This is our largest assignment in charging infrastructure in Sweden and is strategically important showing that we are a stable and long-term partner for the infrastructure of the future. We have built up strong expertise in charging solutions and have the capacity to take on large, complex projects. Parking Malmö operates twelve parking facilities and manages approximately 35 000 parking spaces in both its own and external properties.
